- is qualified to exploit materials and other resources economically
- is qualified to carry out work in a manner taking his or her own safety and that of others into consideration, in addition to safety, health and the environment
- is qualified to plan, carry out and assess his or her own work in accordance with the quality requirements in force at any time
- is qualified to comply with the ethical guidelines, provisions and regulations that apply to the industry
- has knowledge of good service to employers and customers
- is familiar with the industry's history, traditions and special characteristics, as well as new technology and changing requirements and standards
- is familiar with the factors that influence a company's profitability and quality requirements

The final on-the-job training in a company comprises the modules 1: Frames, 2: Gearing, 3: Wheels, 4: Brakes and suspensions, 5: Electro/Electronics, 6: Equipment, 7: Information processing, 8: Communication, 9: Communication, 10: Industry studies.

The holder of this document also has skills on the upper secondary school level in Norwegian, English, mathematics, natural science, social studies and physical education. Adult students may in some cases be exempted from the requirement for these common-core general studies subjects.
